

#### What's New?

- Applications due June 21<sup>st</sup> at 11:59 p.m.
- Chesapeake Bay Agriculture Projects
  - Priority construction funding sources
    - Design and permitting are eligible
    - Countywide Action Plan (CAP) Implementation Grant
    - Agricultural Conservation Assistance Program (ACAP)
    - Agricultural construction projects will be considered for Growing Greener with justification
- 2024 Integrated Water Quality Report



#### What's New?

- Growing Greener Watershed Renaissance Initiative - expanded statewide.
  - Agriculturally impaired small catchments with 25 or fewer land parcels identified by a TMDL or Advanced Restoration Plan (ARP)
- Commonwealth Investment Criteria preference removed
- Act 167 Stormwater Management Planning Grants Program is no longer available through Growing Greener Plus Grants Program





# Eligibility

# Eligible Applicants

- Incorporated watershed associations
- Counties, county planning commissions, or municipalities
- County conservation districts
- Council of governments
- Non-profit organizations
  - 501(c)(3)
  - Registered with Pennsylvania Bureau of Charitable Organizations
- Educational institutions
- Municipal authorities







# Eligible Applications

- Complete/submitted by due date and time through eGrants
- Budget correct, eligible expenses does not exceed maximum amount and meets requirements
- Applicants contacted by deadline
  - DEP
  - Countywide Action Team
  - Conservation District Watershed Specialist
- Good standing with Commonwealth
- Program specific criteria







#### Ineligible Projects

- Negatively impacts public health or out of state
- Post-construction stormwater management BMPs caused by new or proposed construction activities
- No landowner commitment letters for projects on state-owned land
- AMDTreat report missing
- Landowner letters not included or not in the process of being obtained
- Preclude access to or use of forested land for sustainable forestry and commercial production of timber or other forest products



#### Ineligible Projects

- Project does not meet eligibility requirements
- Project workplan missing
- Project exceeds \$500,000 maximum grant request amount
- Applications submitted late
- Projects with less than the required 15% match
- Project sites and/or applicants with outstanding compliance obligations



#### Ineligible Expenses

- Outdoor recreation construction—gazebos, pavilions, decks, trails and bridges
- Dredging of streams, lakes, ponds or other waterways
- Administrative expenses more than five percent
- Registration fees for workshops
- Clothing or give-away materials
- Membership dues not directly related to project implementation




#### Priorities

- 1. BMP Implementation Projects
- 2. Technical Assistance
  - Regional or statewide projects with public-private partnerships that expedite on-the-ground, BMP implementation
- 3. Planning
  - Agricultural erosion and sediment control or nutrient and manure management plans
- 4. Healthy Waters and Watershed Renaissance Initiative
- 5. Priority projects located in or benefiting EJ Areas

#### Preferences

- Projects located or benefiting EJ areas.
- Act 47 financially distressed municipalities
- Co-benefits climate resiliency, as identified in the Pennsylvania 2021
   Climate Action Plan
- Watershed-based plan implementation
- More than the minimum match requirement
- Provides significant improvement to water quality based upon pollutant load reductions
- For existing grantees, failure to submit timely and complete reports and accurate reimbursement requests may result in decreased competitiveness

- Average award \$235,000
- Grant period of performance 3 years



#### Renaissance Initiative


- Reduce nutrient and sediment impairments in agriculturallyimpaired waterways
  - 2024 Integrated Report
- Complete implementation of watershed restoration plans on small catchment areas
  - Approximately 25 or fewer land parcels
  - Centre, Huntingdon, Lancaster,
     Snyder and Union counties
  - Others ARPs and TMDLs






#### Watershed Renaissance Initiative

- Complete BMP implementation in 7 years
- Rapid delisting in 10 years
- Phase 1
  - Landowner education and outreach
  - Agricultural planning
    - Chapter 102 Erosion and Sediment Control and/or Chapter 91 manure management requirements
  - Design/engineering
  - Permitting and Data Management
  - Structural BMPs meet NRCS standards and specifications
- Phase 2 construction



#### TMDL and ARP Catchment Example



#### Common Projects

- Design and Construction
- Most common category of projects
- Agriculture BMP projects on priority areas
- Barnyard improvements, stream fencing, buffers, crossings
- Urban/residential stormwater reductions projects
- To reduce the volume of runoff
- Rain gardens, basin retrofits, MS4-related projects
- Infiltration practices

#### Preparing a Proposal

- Break large projects up into stages
  - Stage 1 Design and permit
  - Stage 2 Construction
- Must discuss with DEP regional or statewide staff prior to submitting application (May 31<sup>st</sup>)
  - Determine project eligibility and relevance
  - Provide guidance in the completion of the application
- Discuss with County Conservation District (May 31<sup>st</sup>)
- Discuss/share with Chesapeake Bay Community Clean Water Coordinator (May 31<sup>st</sup>)
- Must be willing to maintain the project



Start early.
Don't wait until
deadline to
discuss project.





    - Click Register and enter all of the information into the fields with a red asterisk (\*) next to them

- Grant contracts are developed based on the award
  - Signed electronically

  - Verify practices installed
  - Provide guidance on implementation
  - Help with questions
