

Overview

- 53% of impaired waters Nonpoint Source (NPS) Pollution
- Federal Water Pollution Control Act, Section 319(h)
- Goal: Improve and protect PA waters
- <u>Purpose</u>: Provide funding to implement:
 - NPS Management Plan
 - 319 Watershed Implementation Plans (WIPs)
- Objectives: Reduce pollutant loads



NPS Management Plan

Improve and protect from:

- AMD and other energy resource extraction activities
- Agricultural activities
- Stormwater runoff
- Streambank and shoreline degradation

Develop and update watershed plans leading to the improvement and protection


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319 WIPs



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Watershed Implementation Plans (WIPs)



What's New

- Revised application period (April 22 June 21, 2024)
- Three-year subgrant timeframe (October 1, 2025 June 30, 2028)
- Eligibility of BMP implementation projects within Pennsylvania, as listed in approved MD or DE Section 319 WIPs, on a case-by-case basis
- New WIP development projects no longer eligible for funding, however WIP updates are encouraged
- Eligibility of BMP implementation projects within EPA approved
 WIP or watershed-based plan watershed
- Preference for BMP implementation projects in EJ areas.




What's New (Continued)

- Removed preference for watersheds with approved Act 167 plans
- Use 2024 update of DEP's Integrated Report
- Removed Commonwealth Investment Criteria section
- Removed Worker Protection and Investment Certification section, form, and requirement
- Completed G&A form will now be project deliverable
- Administrative funding cannot exceed 10% of total grant funding



Timeline



Eligible Applicants

- Incorporated watershed association
- County or municipality
- County conservation district
- Council of governments
- Non-profit organizations
 - -501(c)(3)
 - Registered with Pennsylvania Bureau of Charitable Organizations
- Educational institution
- Municipal authority



Eligibility Criteria

Applications:

- Are complete, contain all required documents, and are submitted by due date through eGrants
- Contain program-specific criteria
- Include a budget which is correct and meets requirements

Applicants:

Contacted Countywide Action Team (if applicable)



Priorities

Priority given to:

- Agricultural BMP implementation identified in an existing 319
 WIP flexibility to add sites
- 319 WIP BMP implementation projects in Pennsylvania EJ areas



Preferences

Preference given to:

- High priority WIP implementation projects located within critical subwatershed areas
- Projects that effectively address water quality impairments in a cost-effective way
- WIP implementation projects in Tier 1-4 counties within the Chesapeake Bay Watershed
- Projects in approved Act 47 municipalities



Priority Levels

Priorities

Agricultural BMP implementation

WIP implementation in EJ areas

Preferences

- High Priority WIP Implementation in critical subwatersheds
- Cost-effective
- Chesapeake Bay, Tier 1-4

Eligible, but low priority:

- Revising Existing WIPs
- Statewide or Regional
- Implementation in WIP-adjacent watersheds



Additional Considerations

- Existing grantees failure to submit timely & complete reports and reimbursement requests = decreased competitiveness
- Match provided will increase competitiveness

Ineligible projects:

- NPDES
- Farms not covered by manure management or nutrient management plans
- Threaten public health
- Out-of-state projects
- Sites with outstanding compliance obligations
- Outside of EPA approved WIPs or other WBPs



WIP Updates and Revisions

- WIPs must be at least 8 years old
- Must focus on HUC-12 watershed
- WIPs must be submitted by June 30, 2027, with completed WIP checklist
- Must meet EPA's required nine, minimum watershed plan elements for threatened or impaired waters

ATTTAINS Assessment Unit ID	 2022 Integrated Report Viewer Zoom in to lake or stream segment Click on the stream segment and the ATTAINS ID will be shown as PA-SCR- followed by an 8-digit number (streams) or a PA-LRP-followed by an 8-digit number (lakes)
Latitude and Longitude	 Decimal degrees Multiple sites = multiple coordinates
PA NPS Management Plan	2024 updateGoals and Objectives
Supports Other Work	 Projects from other funding sources, and relationship to this project
Supports WIP Completion	Numbered project in WIP, priority level in WIP, other projects in subwatershed



Workplan Section IV.A-C

Problem/Need Statement	 Reference the WIP and Integrated Report List impairment sources and causes – link to proposed activities Make a case for the environmental benefit Brief description and project # of any prior 319-funded project directly linked
Goals and Objectives	 List main goals and objectives/tasks needed to meet each goal Describe how project addressed impairment sources and causes If implementing actions from a County-wide Action Plan (CAP), provide County name CAP action number, if available Sector BMP name, proposed amount, and units Construction projects – BMP type, quantity, & units, and associated load reductions Non-construction projects - BMP type, quantity, & units, permits needed, and data such as estimated load reductions (provide source)
Project Description	 Provide more detail on the above listed goals and objectives Include outcomes and project-specific, detailed task-level information



Workplan Section IV.D-F

Monitoring	 Discuss why monitoring is needed and how the data will be used If 319 funds are proposed to be used for lab analysis or equipment, data must be uploaded to EPA's Water Quality Exchange (WQX) database
QAPPs	 If 319 funds are proposed to be used for water quality monitoring, a QAPP must be developed and approved by EPA. List QAPP development early in timeline.
On-Site BMPs/BMP Efficacy/Load Reductions	 Provide predicted load reductions Provide model used



Workplan Section IV.G-J

Sub-Grantees	List proposed subcontractors (if known) and describe their tasks/activities
Partner Contributions	 Equivalent to "match" in budget No required match; however, match improves competitiveness If no match, explain why List contributor name, contribution description In-kind or monetary accepted Must equal the amounts in the budget
Education/Outreach	 Explain how activities address environmental problem and contribute to water quality improvement Explain landowner recruitment
Urban/MS4 Activities	Workplans must clearly indicate that the proposed activities do not explicitly address a permit requirement for any MS4.



Workplan Section IV.K-M

OM&R Plan	 If constructing BMP, OM&R Plan is required If designing BMP, draft OM&R Plan is required Provide the lifespan for each BMP
Competitive Bid	 Describe the process that will be used to select subcontractors If not using a competitive bid process, provide detailed explanation In either case, design or construction projects must abide by PA Procurement Code
Contingency Plan (AMD)	 Explain whether plan is in place or needing to be developed Reference existing plan

Timeline	 Start Date: October 1, 2025 End Date: No later than June 30, 2028 Complete for all deliverables: Task-level Start and completion dates




Workplan Section IV.P-S

Budget Summary	 All significant deliverables must have their own task table Use the Task and Deliverables Budget Worksheet (Excel) as basis for this summary and ensure all dollar amounts match Both the Excel budget and this Summary must be in whole numbers Salaries/benefits – round to dollar Mileage – round miles traveled to result in whole dollar
Maps and Photos	 Insert here, and provide as separate attachments to the online application Location map Aerial photo Site map(s) Photos
Landowner	 Describe the landowner situation & mention if one of the following is attached: Design projects – Landowner Letter of Commitment (DEP form) Construction projects – full Landowner-Grantee Agreement (DEP form)
AMD Treat	Design or construction of AMD treatment facilities must include AMD Treat report
